- ensure your child feels safe and happy at school
- tell you if your child's lateness or attendance is a problem
- contact you if your child is not in school and you have not told us why
- encourage your child to work hard and do their best
- set and mark homework
- share with you any concerns about your child's work or behaviour
- tell you about your child's progress at termly parents' evenings and in their school Report
- tell you what is happening in school in a weekly newsletter
- follow Local Authority Child Protection procedures
- consult with you on aspects of school life
